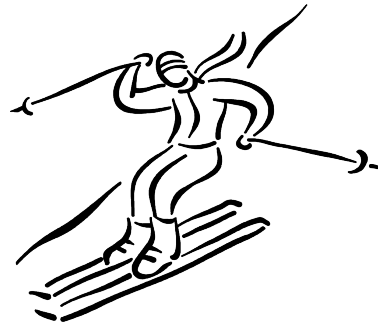
Friday: Go to dining room first for check-in.

Upon graduating from Stanford University in 1972, Brian began to minister to Stanford students through Peninsula Bible Church. In 1974 Brian was invited to join the pastoral staff and worked with youth and college age students for 12 years. In 1985 he moved to the church's new branch in Cupertino, where he continues to serve. After his 1988 encounter with a Romanian poet, who was imprisoned for seventeen years under Ceausescu's reign of terror, Brian developed a passion for Hebrew poetry (especially the Psalms) and found it to be an effective tool to embrace one's grief and transcend pain. Now he delights in transforming left-brain engineers into storytellers and poets. Brian and his wife, Emily, have five children (two died in infancy) and four grandchildren.
