Allote From The Pastor Dear church family,

We are now three months into our journey together, and there are two things I want to encourage us in at this time: patience and purpose.

PATIENCE For some, there will be things that haven't happened quick enough. Maybe it's the formation of a team, the answer to a question of vision, or an area you'd like to serve in. Maybe you haven't gotten to know myself or other new people as quickly as you would have liked, or maybe you thought there would be more growth initially. We can all be guilty of putting our own expectations and timelines on what we think God should be doing. (I know I can). So, let me encourage you in the words of James 1:4 (NKJV), "But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing." Let's continue to wait on the Lord for how He is unfolding this story of revitalization!

PURPOSE For others, there has been a lot of change and too quickly! Maybe it feels like your church is changing so fast that it seems you are on a boat and the waters are tipping, and all around you it feels unstable. As I said when I first came to be your pastor, there are two constants in life, the Gospel and change! Our only security is not in the way things have been in the past, but in Christ who holds our future. That's easy to say until your ministry—or style preference in church—changes. Then, it's a bit harder! I want to encourage you that each decision we are making is purposeful with the goal of being a church that will continue to grow and make disciples of Jesus Christ. In the gospel of Mark, Jesus was a man of action, and things changed and happened rapidly. That is part of what it's like to follow our Savior—to be people who can be flexible and change as He leads us! I can't quarantee you won't be affected by change, but I can guarantee we, as leaders, care about the whole church as we ride the waves of change.
