Allote From The Pastor

Dear Church Family,

This week in our elders meeting, we were continuing our journey through the book of Phillipians. In chapter 4:2-9, Paul gives four key points that are relevant to our journey as a church in revitalization.

## 1. UNITY

Paul shows how every relationship in the body is important. The personal relationship of two ladies had the potential to derail the important gospel partnership of this church. It's the same for us. We need to keep striving for unity in the bond of peace (Eph. 4). We are all important in this effort!

# 2. REJOICING

Paul says to, "rejoice always," and he says it again, "rejoice!" In a new situation for all of us, the temptation can be to only see the things that we don't like. It takes intentional work to identify, "what we rejoice in." So take some time this week and write down or share what is worth rejoicing over in God's work in our church right now.

## 3. REDEEMING

In this passage, Paul encourages us to take everything to the cross. Our situation at hand, could cause anxiety, or any circumstance in the church. Redeem them through prayer, supplication, rejoicing, meditating on the good, and striving for unity. We can follow Paul and the biblical model of not naïve positivity but of redemptive rejoicing as we process each step of our lives as a church through the cross.

## 4. PEACE

This is the result when we strive for unity. Rejoice in what God is doing and take all the hard things to him for redemption! God doesn't promise peace. When we understand all the change, the decisions, or even His direction. But peace comes when we trust in him in the ways Paul has outlined. I'm praying we do these things and the God of peace remains with us in the process of revitalization! Dastror Kirk
